

THE AT-RISK HORSE:

A 2009 survey conducted by the UHC revealed three primary reasons why a horse reaches an at-risk state:

- 1. changes in owner's situation
- 2. the horse is too old or injured
- 3. the horse is unmanageable

OWN RESPONSIBLY,
OWNING RESPONSIBILITY:

Regardless of how a particular horse reaches a state of being at-risk, it is the **responsibility** of every **owner**, and the **industry** at large, to ensure that **we** are doing everything possible to prevent horses from becoming at-risk. Luckily, this issue is recognized by equine organizations, businesses, and individuals alike, and is one for which numerous industry groups are currently working towards a solution.

The **United Horse Coalition** is one of them.

COLLABORATE:

The **United Horse Coalition** is a broad alliance of equine organizations that have joined together under the **American Horse Council** (**AHC**) to educate the equine industry about the issue of horses at-risk or in transition.

The UHC is an **educational alliance** that seeks to provide information for current and prospective owners, breeders, sellers, and horse organizations, regarding the **long-term responsibilities** of owning and caring for horses, as well as focusing on opportunities available for these horses. UHC also provides information regarding end of life decisions, including veterinary care, euthanasia, and disposal options.
