





Potentially ~70,000+ horses annually based on daily Max Cap. and LOS (EWDC)


Intakes by Type

Relinquished by owner Stray Transfer In Owner-Intended Euthanasia Other Intakes






Equine Outcomes by Type Jan-June 2019







Main Points of Logistical Differences


- Physiology




